





Our team was excited to join this collaborative, solutions-driven contest and contribute to Xylem’s mission of “solving water challenges” for communities everywhere.

We built Predictvent, an AI + IoT-powered disaster resilience app that:

Prevents: Sends user-friendly safety tips and planning

Protects: Enables voice SOS + GPS alerts (even offline via satellite) during disasters.

Features include:

- Rugged IoT torch (solar + GPS + flashlight + SOS)
- Mobile app for farmers, residents, volunteers, and authorities
- Community reporting and volunteer coordination
- Works offline and in low-connectivity regions
- Supports local languages and simple visuals for easy use

RESULT :

We aimed to solve this gap with our project.

Our Magic Solution: Predictvent

We are proud to share that Team Predictvent won the Grand Prize in the high school category, out of nearly 3000 global teams, earning \$5,000 USD (4,25,000 INR). This recognition motivates us to continue working on

Predictvent, aiming to pilot it in real communities and help people prepare better for disasters.


The Climbing Cost of Living: Inflation in Everyday Life

Inflation is a crucial economic concept that affects everyone, from national policymakers to ordinary citizens - and even students. It refers to the general rise in the prices of goods and services over a period of time, which results in the decrease of the purchasing power of money. Simply put, as inflation increases, each rupee buys less than it used to. For instance, if a litre of milk that cost ₹50 last year now costs ₹60, it means inflation has occurred. In India, inflation is measured using two main indices: the Consumer Price Index (CPI), which reflects price changes at the consumer level, and the Wholesale Price Index (WPI), which tracks prices at the wholesale or production level. There are various types of inflation, such as demand-pull inflation, which happens when demand for goods and services exceeds supply; cost-push inflation, caused by rising production costs like fuel prices or wages; imported inflation, due to increased prices of imported goods like crude oil; and built-in inflation, where rising wages and prices feed off each other in a continuous cycle. The CPI is more relevant for daily life as it includes essential items such as food, housing, education, and healthcare. Inflation in India can be triggered by a variety of causes. One major factor is the country's dependence on agriculture, which is vulnerable to monsoons. A weak monsoon can lead to crop shortages and higher food prices. India also imports a large portion of its crude oil, so rising global oil prices directly affect domestic transport and manufacturing costs. Another contributor is the fiscal deficit, which occurs when the government spends more than it earns, often increasing the money supply in the economy and driving up prices. Additionally, rapid population growth increases the demand for essential goods and services, which, if not matched by supply, results in price hikes. Other global factors, such as supply chain disruptions, currency depreciation, or international conflicts, can also

influence inflation in India. These rising costs affect everyone, including students, who experience higher school fees, transportation charges, stationery costs, and even food prices. Families often have to make adjustments to their monthly budgets, and people with fixed incomes - like pensioners - find it particularly hard to cope with rapidly increasing costs.

To manage inflation, both the Reserve Bank of India (RBI) and the Government of India play important roles. The RBI uses monetary policy tools like the Bank rate, which is the rate at which it lends money to commercial banks. By increasing the repo rate during high inflation, the RBI makes borrowing more expensive and reduces spending in the economy, helping to bring down prices. The government, on the other hand, can use fiscal measures such as subsidies, tax reductions, and public welfare schemes like the Public Distribution System (PDS) to help control the cost of essential goods. The ideal inflation target set by the RBI is 4%, with an acceptable range of 2% to 6%. A moderate level of inflation is good for the economy, as it encourages spending and investment, but high or unpredictable inflation can damage economic stability and reduce savings. For students, understanding inflation is not just important for exams, but also for real life. It helps us become financially aware, responsible in our spending habits, and better prepared for the future as informed citizens of an economically developing nation.




Self-study also teaches us how to manage our time and take responsibility. It doesn't mean we should stop going to school or coaching it means we should not depend completely on them.



The next day, we visited the Indian Institute of




Technology (IIT) Madras. It was really cool to see such a big and famous campus.
